



## TWIC PROGRAM

The Transportation Worker Identification Credential (TWIC) is a vital security measure that will ensure individuals who pose a threat do not gain unescorted access to secure areas of the nation's maritime transportation system.

TWIC was established by Congress through the Maritime Transportation Security Act (MTSA) and is administered by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) and U.S. Coast Guard. TWICs are tamper-resistant biometric credentials that will be issued to workers who require unescorted access to secure areas of ports, vessels, outer continental shelf facilities and all credentialed merchant mariners. It is anticipated that more than 1 million workers including longshoremen, truckers, port employees and others will be required to obtain a TWIC.

Appointments are not required but applicants may pre-enroll through the TSA website.

## **General Information**

- What is TWIC?
  - o TWIC is a common identification credential for all personnel requiring unescorted access to secure areas of <u>MTSA</u>-regulated facilities and vessels, and all mariners holding Coast Guard-issued credentials. Individuals who meet TWIC eligibility requirements will be issued a tamper-resistant credential containing the worker's biometric (fingerprint template) to allow for a positive link between the card and the individual.
- Who must get a TWIC?
  - We anticipate that over 1.2 million individuals will apply for a TWIC. This includes
    Coast Guard-credentialed merchant mariners, port facility employees, long shore workers,
    truck drivers, and others requiring unescorted access to secure areas of maritime facilities
    and vessels regulated by MTSA.

- How do I get access to the Port if I do not have a TWIC?
  - Anybody with business at the Port and without a TWIC must arrange for a trained escort through either the facility to be visited or through an escort for hire service <u>BEFORE</u> arriving at the Port. Escorts for hire at the Port of Hueneme are available by contacting:

Anticipated Fee Schedule is as follows:

During regular Port hours of Monday thru Friday 8 am to 5 pm - \$80 for the first two hours; all additional hours or portion thereof will be at the rate of \$30 per hour.

During non-regular hours, including nights, weekends, and Holidays, there will be a surcharge of \$30 in addition to any applicable rates.

Anticipated Fee Schedule is as follows:

During regular Port hours of Monday thru Friday 8 am to 5 pm - \$60 per hour. Or there will be the option to have your scheduled load picked up and taken off-site for pick-up for \$150.
