

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

VENTURA COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, DBA OXNARD COLLEGE

And

The Port of Hueneme, Oxnard Harbor District

This MOU is made between VENTURA COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, OXNARD COLLEGE (OC) and The Port of Hueneme, Oxnard Harbor District (The Port), resulting from an agreement to engage in educational –business activities and projects that support the OC Promise and educational experiences to increase student success at Oxnard College.

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to formally document the partnership between The Port and OC, which is two-fold:

- 1. It supports the OC Promise that offers local K-12 school students the knowledge and encouragement to create a college-going culture, provides educational opportunities to prepare them to be successful, exposes them to career pathways and; supports continued success in the form of financial scholarships during their first year at OC, given they maintain a specific GPA and are a full-time OC student.
- 2. It aids in the educational experience by providing a mechanism by which Oxnard College students and faculty can benefit from the staff expertise, unique facilities, exposure to global trade and mentoring environments related to The Port. The deliverables established in this MOU are in alignment with the Mission Statement of Oxnard College; "OC is a learning-centered institution that embraces academic excellence by providing multiple pathways to student success". In addition, it supports three overarching goals of the college; provide outstanding integrated college programs & services, innovate to achieve equitable & inclusive student success and, actively partner with the community. It is Oxnard College's goal to also *Grow our own Leaders of the Future* that work in our community and support the successes of our local industries & businesses.

THE BENEFITS TO THE PORT include but are not limited to:

- Promotion and facilitation of the education of future logistical engineers, global economists, and Maritime professionals.
- Enhanced perspective on projects by exposure to the ideas of the academic community.

- Increased opportunities for recruiting local talent that has been exposed to The Port throughout their college experience.
- Potential for collaborative efforts with OC students and/or Faculty & Staff in various Business and Global/International Logistics as they relate to Maritime disciplines of study.

2. PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT ACTIVITIES

The partnership activities between The Port and Oxnard College may include but are not limited to:

- A. Support events and initiatives of the OC Foundation in the amount of \$2500 to facilitate achieving items B through M.
- B. The Port may offer visits, tours and demonstrations at its facilities for faculty and students for educational purposes related to maritime systems and technologies as well as enlighten students about career opportunities and the educational pathway to obtain the career.
- C. The Port may provide educational events (i.e. MAST) of which OC students and Faculty are allowed to participate and contribute, as appropriate.
- D. Student Internships/Job Shadowing: The Port may offer students the opportunity to obtain internships or job shadowing experiences, based on discipline of study and/or educational performance.
- E. The Port may offer Port personnel to participate in mentoring programs and activities for OC students to promote the acquisition of business acumen, self-efficacy and student success
- F. The Port may make Port personnel available to co-teach courses or to assist in the development of courses/curriculum and related educational material; and may provide relevant educational material.
- G. The Port may cooperate with OC in developing a program under which students may be given academic credit for work on Port projects and/or research.
- H. The port may provide student' opportunities for cooperative education and/or employment of students through existing or new programs.
- I. The Port may provide opportunities for summer work or summer bridge programs for OC students as well as sabbatical projects/positions at the Port for OC Faculty & Counselors.
- J. The Port may provide academic and career advice/information/workshops/trainings to OC students in cooperation with OC faculty and counselors.
- K. The Port may offer appropriate information or data on future maritime studies, global markets, logistics and technology requirements in those areas related to Port's mission responsibilities.
- L. The Port may establish opportunities for Port employees to attend OC and earn degrees that support their professional development and/or growth of Port personnel.
- M. OC Foundation to provide visibility of Port support and opportunities to market the Port and OC partnership.

3. MEETINGS OF THE PARTNERS.

The Partners shall maintain an ongoing dialogue regarding the status of the Partners' activities under this Agreement. The Partners will meet as needed in order to discuss the progress of projects undertaken through this Agreement, to resolve any issues that arise in the performance of this Agreement, and to seek agreement on future projects to be pursued under this Agreement.

4. ADVISORY SERVICES.

In order to achieve the objectives of promoting the economic and educational growth and ensuring the availability of a stable workforce that can meet the needs of The Port, the Port may designate a liaison to OC advisory councils for technical, business or other maritime-related programs.

5. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

The Port shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws and regulations and local ordinances in the performance of the MOU.

6. MODIFICATION PROVISIONS

Either party may from time-to-time request changes or amendments to this MOU. Such changes or amendments, which are mutually agreed upon by and between OC and The Port, shall be effective only when incorporated in written amendments to this MOU.

7. NONDISCRIMINATION CLAUSE

During the term of the MOU, The Port agrees as follows: In the hiring of any employees for the performance of work, or any other activity required under the MOU or any subcontract, the Port, subcontractor or any person acting on behalf of the Port or subcontractor shall not by reason of sex, race, creed, color, disability, national origin, ancestry or age discriminate against any citizen who is qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates. Neither the Port nor any subcontractor, nor any person on their behalf, shall in any manner discriminate against any employee involved in the performance of work or any other activity required under the MOU on account of sex, race, creed, color, disability, national origin, ancestry or age.

8. INDEMNIFICATION CLAUSE

Oxnard College agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Port, its officers, agents, employees, individually and collectively, from and against all claims liabilities, obligations and causes of action of whatever kind arising in any manner whatsoever out of or in connection with the acts or omissions of Ventura Community College District and/or Oxnard College, Board of Trustees, officers, agents, and employees.

The Port agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless Oxnard College, its Board of Trustees, officers, agents, and employees, individually and collectively, from and against all claims liabilities, obligations and causes of action of whatever kind arising in any manner whatsoever out of or in connection with the acts or omissions of the Port, officers, agents and employees.

9. TERMINATION

Either party may at its option terminate this MOU at any time upon giving thirty (30) days' advance notice in writing to the other party in the manner herein specified.

10. <u>DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION</u>

The Port certifies that, to the best of its knowledge and belief, that the Port and/or any of its Principals or sub-contractors are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, or declared ineligible from participation in Federal assistance programs or activities, and neither it, nor any of its principals or sub-contractors, is listed on the list of Parties Excluded from Federal Programs found in SAM (System for Award Management).

The ports of Long Beach and Los Angeles may have bigger and longer-running environmental initiatives, but the Port of Hueneme managed to beat them to the punch this month by becoming the first California seaport to earn certification in the <u>Green Marine program</u>, which helps ports, terminal operators and shipping lines reduce their environmental footprint, the port revealed Monday.

Each program participant completes Green Marine's detailed annual self-evaluation, and the results determine the participant's ranking for each performance indicator on a 1-to-5 scale. Level 1 constitutes the monitoring of regulations, while Level 5 indicates leadership and excellence.

Individual results are made public every year, and reports are independently verified every other year. Participants in the program, which includes ship owners, ports, Seaway corporations, terminals and shipyards, must demonstrate year-over-year improvement in measurable ways to maintain their Green Marine certification.

Green Marine's environmental program assists and provides criteria using 11 performance indicators, including air emissions, prevention of spills and leakages, community impacts, and environmental leadership. The port has said that it received the highest possible scores in the spill prevention, environmental leadership, and community impact categories. Being that Green Marine is completely voluntary, it affirms even further Port of Hueneme's commitment to staying on the leading edge of environmental stewardship.

Membership in Green Marine requires that members demonstrate year-over-year meaningful improvements in measurable ways to maintain their Green Marine certification. Green Marine's metrics and their results are independently verified and released to the public.

In addition to the Port of Hueneme, current participants in the program include the Alabama State Port Authority, DP World, Kinder Morgan, Northwest Seaport Alliance, Pacific Coast Terminals, Seaspan, Toronto Port Authority and dozens more.




